





 - crawl configuration

"Decisions made during processing can greatly affect who, what, where, when, why and how researchers access and understand the digital material within a given collection. For us, the Processing Information section is therefore one of the most important aspects of any finding aid that describes born-digital materials. In particular, processing legacy borndigital material can often involve changing the nature of the data to preserve it and make it accessible."

Berdini et al., "Describing Digital," p.8

Consider the following questions while describing a group of seeds:

What is this collection for? Who is it for? What is the general scope and content? Why these seeds and not others? What was the selection criteria?

A collection-level record is recommended to describe a curated group of web archive seeds. A descriptive overview to highlight a theme, topic(s), event, or other criteria can provide much needed context for a collection of individual websites. Recent literature about the perspective of researchers using web archives collections has identified the user-end need for transparency and understanding the curator's rationale for the selection of websites to be archived, contributing to an emerging concept of 'web archives provenance'.
